Family Together Time

Try this fun family activity to see how we can put fears in perspective.

- Grab a flashlight, and give it to someone who'll be the Shadow Master.
- Everyone else will stand a few feet away from a wall, facing the wall.
- The Shadow Master will get random household objects, turn off the lights, and use the flashlight to cast a big shadow of the object on the wall.
- Family members can take turns guessing what the object is based on its shadow.
- Switch roles so everyone can be the Shadow Master.
- Talk about how looking at the giant shadow changed the way you saw an everyday object.
- Talk about what can make fears feel big.
- Pray that you'll see fears from God's perspective—they're so much smaller than he is.
